A RESOLUTION

Requesting the Office of External Affairs, FSM National Government, to place more emphasis on the subject of foreign aid, and to focus its attention primarily on those countries that are most able to provide assistance in a significant way.

1 WHEREAS, it is the sense of the FSM Congress that the Office of
2 External Affairs should place more emphasis on the subject of foreign
3 aid, and focus its attention primarily on those countries most able
4 to provide assistance in a significant way; and

5 WHEREAS, it is the sense of the FSM Congress that countries
6 such as Japan, Taiwan, South Korea, West Germany, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait,
7 Australia, and New Zealand, given the health and vigor of their economies,
8 should be approached before any other countries; and

9 WHEREAS, it is the sense of the FSM Congress that at this point in
10 time in our economic development, the outside infusion of capital
11 is very important to our future economic development, now, therefore,

12 BE IT RESOLVED by the Second Congress of the Federated States of
13 Micronesia, First Special Session, 1981, that the Office of External
14 Affairs, Federated States of Micronesia National Government, is hereby
15 requested to place more emphasis on the subject of foreign aid, and to
16 focus its attention primarily on those countries that are most able
17 to provide assistance in a significant way; and

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this resolution
19 be transmitted to Secretary Andon Amaraich, Department of External
20 Affairs, and President of the Federated States of Micronesia,
21 Tosiwo Nakayama.
