Dear Chairman Amaraich:

My response to your letter of February 8 has been somewhat delayed because I thought it important that you first receive the State Department's reply on behalf of Secretary Vance to questions you and your colleagues raised in your meeting with him on January 17. I assume that by now you have received that response through your Commission's legal counsel. The assurances contained in that reply at the direction of Secretary Vance are clear and unequivocal expressions of the new administration's attitude on this matter.

As for myself, I have been assured that no electronic surveillance was ever conducted during the time I have been responsible for the status negotiations. It should also be understood that, contrary to the implication of some press agrunts, the Status Liaison Office has never been involved in any covert activity. Meet importantly, I have no reason whatsoever to believe that any 274 nativity in Micronesia ever influenced the substance of the neg birth as.

It is certainly regrettable that remarkant and distrust have been aroused by the allegations ab ut 'IA antivities in Micronesia. But let me say in all candor that I restly believe this anfortanate problem should be relegated to the past. It seems to no that, with the assurances you and your colleagues have now received, we with to be able to move forward in a fresh spirit of ecoperation and with a remaine intention to pursue our negotiations in a constructive way tellitting the basic good will and friendship which surely exist between our proples.
